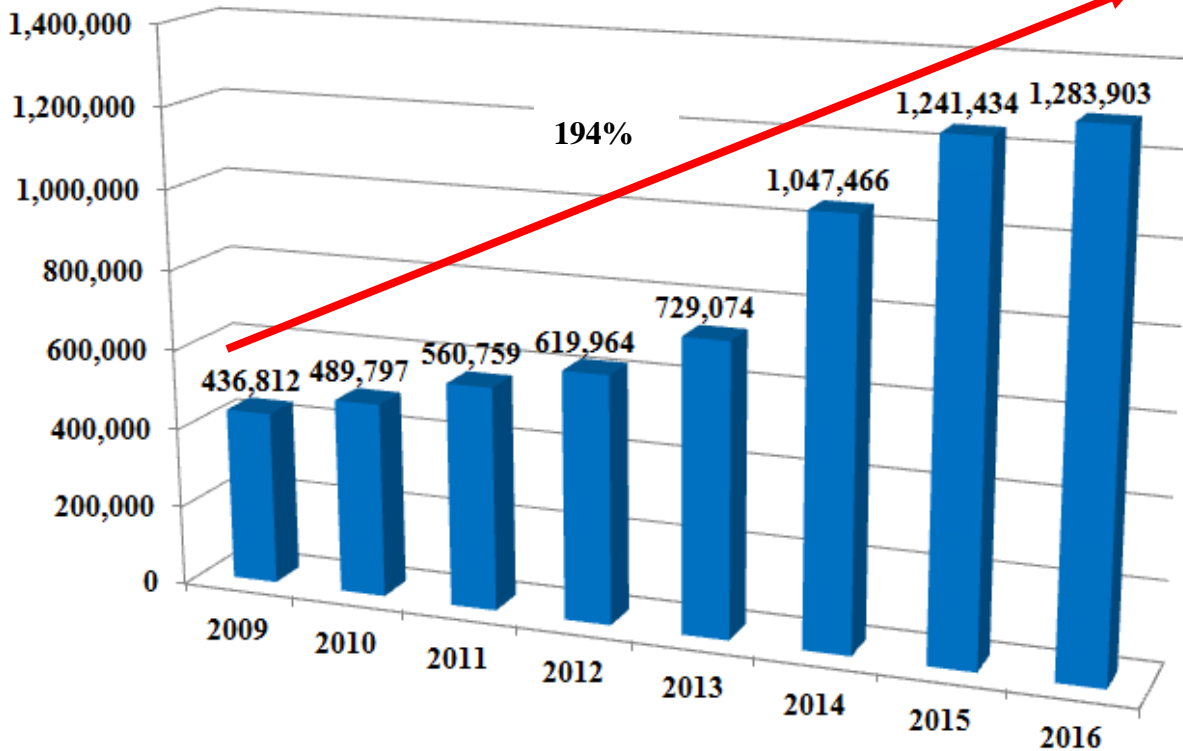


Counties have experienced increases in Medicaid caseloads. In recent years, a number of factors have led to caseload increases, such as:

- The economic downturn of 2008 and state population growth
- Medicaid expansion for Adults without Dependent Children (5/2012)
- The Affordable Care Act (10/2013)
- Counties assuming responsibility for a major statewide Medicaid eligibility contract.

Colorado counties administered a **194% growth** in clients on Medicaid from FY 2008-09 to November 30, 2015
